Beginner's Guide to Buying Filters

Neutral density filters (ND filters) act like sunglasses for your camera, either for a portion of the frame or for your entire shot. ND filters are usually rated from 1-10 stops. In other words, that's the amount of stops by which you can reduce your shutter speed once you've mounted the filter on your lens.

Coloured filters are used primarily for black and white photography, as a means of controlling tone rather than colour. They work by filtering out certain wavelengths of light while letting others pass through, and by doing so they change the contrast between different areas.

Screw-on filters: The most common, and easiest, way to attach or mount a camera filter is to screw a ring-shaped filter onto the lens. Screw-on filters come in a variety of sizes to match the diameter of the lens. Determine if you need a 52 mm, 58 mm, 62 mm, 67 mm, 72 mm, 77 mm, or another size filter.

Most "solid" ND filters are round and screw onto the front of the lens. Larger lenses may have circular drop-in filters. However, some ND filters are rectangular or square-shaped and are inserted into special holders that affix to the front of the lens. The filter ratings for round and rectangular filters are identical.
