Most of the time, when playing in a major key, the matching major scale should be used for improvisation. The natural minor scale adds a minor 3rd, minor 6th and minor 7th. When playing in a minor key, you'll probably want to use the minor scale (of one of its variants below) of the same key.

To start, just use the thinnest three strings rather than trying to incorporate the whole scale at once. To take it a step further, start with just the notes on the thinnest string and then add in one string at a time. This can give you a chance to understand the practical application of all of the theory you've learned.

Most music has melodies and improvised solos that are closely related to the notes in the chords. For instance, if the chord being played is an F maj7 chord, at that moment the melody will most likely use tones that exist in the chord: F, A, C and E.. While many other tones can be used to “fill in space”, to create tension, or increase interest in the melody, it’s important to understand ...

They are really useful when improvising. Learn to play the scales in 3rds, 4ths, 5ths, 6ths, 3 in a line, 4 in a line, etc. Example: Major scale = 1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15. C major scale = C D E F G A B C D E F G A B C. 3rds = 1 3, 2 4, 3 5, 4 6, 5 7, 6 8, 7 9, 8 10, 9 11, etc.

The chord-scale approach is based on the idea that if a chord is diatonic to a scale, then that scale can be used as a source to derive melody on that chord. Using the chord-scale approach gives improvisers (especially less proficient ones) greater melodic and rhythmic mobility (i.e., they can improvise pitch sequences in eighth notes, triplets, sixteenth notes, etc.).

We'll be playing the scale in E. Harmonic Minor Scale. When the V 7 chord appears in minor music, the third of the chord is usually raised to become the leading tone The note one half step below the root of a key. So-called because it tends to "lead" back to the root of the key by way of half step resolution., a note not in the minor scale above. At this moment in the music, the improviser will also play this tone (7 instead of b7) or avoid the use of 7 altogether.

But while beginner and intermediate guitarists can master blues improvisation relatively easily — the minor pentatonic scale works perfectly over all three chords — ii-V-I sequences present a tougher challenge. Technically, it's possible to use just one scale over the three chords: the Ionian (major) scale of the tonic chord. However, the major scale gives the absolute opposite of a jazzy feel to your solo licks and sounds rote and tired when played over tunes with multiple ii-V-I changes.

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
