They felt that the rigidity of ballet was not compatible with their main purpose of communication. Forgoing the usual look and concept of costumes, structured techniques, and shoes of ballet, modern dancers preferred a style that was less restrictive.

Fran ç ois Delsarte (1811 - 1871, France). He is considered as a precursor by modern dance history because he invents a theory about the relationship between human movement and feelings. His researches lead him to conclude that to each emotion or mental image corresponds a movement, or at least an attempt of it.
