Mix the paint thoroughly. Use an electric paint mixer or handheld stirrer to blend the paint to an even consistency, even if it was mixed when you purchased it. This will prevent the oils and pigments from separating, result in better coverage and a smoother finish. Once the paint reaches a uniform texture throughout, it will be ready to go.

Tips to Paint Like a Fauve . Paint everyday scenes or landscapes. For portraits look at those done by Henri Matisse, such as Green Stripe, done in 1905. Use bright, saturated colors. Mixing colors to tone them down is not required. Straight from the tube is encouraged. Don't worry about creating the illusion of deep space.
