

Language Disorders In Bilingual Children And S Second Edition

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It has come to my attention that sometimes children who are bilingual with a true language disorder do not receive services due to claims that they have a language difference. Assessing individuals who are bilingual poses many concerns because we do not want to over-identify (children do not have a disorder but were given services and miss time from their regular education) or to under-identify (children with true disorders do not receive services) bilingual children with language disorders.

Bilingual children with typical development can be overdiagnosed as having language impairment when tested in their less dominant or weaker language. Bilingual children with language impairment can be underdiagnosed when information about typical bilingual development is scarce and bilingual norms are missing.

Identifying language impairment in bilingual children ...

A child is bilingual when they are able to use and understand two languages. Bilingualism is not a language problem. When a child has a language difficulty in both of their languages, this is classed as a language problem. When a child has a language difficulty in English but not their home language, this is not a language disorder or delay.

Speech and language difficulties in bilingual children ...

Abstract. Purpose: To investigate an assessment approach that incorporates a parent questionnaire (ALDeQ) and two language processing tasks (nonword repetition [NWR] and recalling sentences [RS]) administered in English to differentiate bilingual children with Developmental Language Disorder (DLD) from typically developing (TD) bilingual children. Method: Participants were 42 typically developing bilingual children (biTD) and 19 bilingual children with DLD (biDLD).

Identifying language disorder in bilingual children aged 2 ...

A language disorder is just as likely to affect bilingual children as monolingual children. A child with a language disorder will experience difficulties acquiring language if brought up in a monolingual or bilingual environment. A bilingual child presenting with language disorder will experience difficulties acquiring both (all) their languages.

The creativity and cognitive flexibility brought about by bilingualism may even prove to be protective for children with developmental disorders. Last year, researchers found that children with Autistic Spectrum Conditions and Down's Syndrome were not placed at a disadvantage by bilingualism. Researchers completed a systematic review and found that there was "no detrimental effect of raising children with ASDs in a bilingual home" (Wang et al. 2018).

Clinical Implications of Research on Language Development ...

Bilingualism is not a disorder. Bilingualism does not cause or contribute to a speech, language, communication or feeding and swallowing disorders. Bilingual individuals are vulnerable to misdiagnosis where diversity is mistaken for disorder.

New 'Vienna Model' for assessment of bilingual children ...

Bilingual children can be easily misdiagnosed as having a language disorder. Language tests for bilingual children that are based on English [or another language] assessments are flawed not only because bilingual children may acquire certain language structures differently from monolinguals but because the sequence and rate of acquisition of specific language components varies between different languages.
