### Crafting the Ideal OT Note - Occupational Therapy Resources

Activities that aren ’ t tailored to your goals may not be very useful. You might even skip your appointments because you don ’ t see how occupational therapy is helping you. Real Life Example: If you had a stroke, you may still want or need to prepare your own meals while you ’ re recovering. Your OT or OTA should spend time helping you reach this goal by showing you the best ways to do things like reaching into cupboards and turning on the stove.

OTs often work with people with mental health problems, disabilities, injuries, or impairments.
