Safeguarding children affected by parental alcohol and ...

'Parental substance misuse' is the long-term misuse of drugs and/or alcohol by a parent or carer. This includes parents and carers who: consume harmful amounts of alcohol (for example if their drinking is leading to alcohol-related health problems or accidents) are dependent on alcohol; use drugs regularly and excessively; are dependent on drugs.

Living in a household where a parent or carer misuses substances doesn't mean a child will experience abuse but it can be a risk. Substance misuse can have negative effects on children at different stages in their lives. During pregnancy, drinking and drug use can put babies at risk of birth defects, premature birth, being born underweight and withdrawal symptoms. In later years, substance misuse can put children at risk of: physical and emotional abuse or neglect

Parental substance misuse can cause considerable harm. Children are at risk from emotional and physical neglect as they grow up. They also risk developing emotional and social problems later in life. Both outcomes are of growing concern to policy and practice.

The effect of parental substance abuse on young people | JRF

The main impact of parental substance misuse (PSM) on child development can be summarised as follows: In utero exposure to drugs and alcohol may affect bonding, health and development (short and long term). PSM adversely affects attachment, family dynamics and relationships. PSM significantly increases the risk of physical and emotional neglect.

The impact of parental substance misuse on child development

Substance misuse When someone in the family is addicted to drugs or alcohol, it can cause stress, violence and neglect. Children living with parents who drink excessively tell us it make them feel confused and alone. Our project workers are there when they need to talk.

Multiple studies identifying the effects of parental substance misuse on children are identified, including physical and psychological impacts on aspects such as basic care, ensuring safety, emotional warmth, stimulation, guidance and boundaries and stability, parenting skills, parents' perceptions, control of emotions, neglect of physical needs, and parent-child attachment relationships.

Children and families, Health and social care, Law and order Children affected by parental substance misuse Substance misuse is often long-term in nature and can lead to sustained problems of child neglect or other forms of abuse, meaning children affected by it are among the most vulnerable and require particular care and support.

□ Parental alcohol misuse (PAM) refers to a spectrum of problem drinking by those with parental responsibility for children. □ It is unclear how many children across the UK this affects. □ Most studies focus on the effects of parents' harmful and dependent drinking on children, including educational and behavioural effects and impacts on physical and mental health. □ Services for families affected by PAM can be provided by local authorities or charities and vary geographically.

Parental Alcohol Misuse and Children

Substance misuse by a parent or carer is widely recognised as one of the factors that puts children more at risk of harm. The biggest risk posed to children is that parents, when under the influence of drugs or alcohol, are unable to keep their child safe (including overlay through co-sleeping and accidents caused through lack of supervision).

Parents who misuse substances: Learning from case reviews ...

Parental alcohol misuse disrupts everyday routines and leads to inconsistent and unpredictable parenting. Children may feel isolated, stigmatised, and guilty, and may have to take on caring responsibilities. Experiencing PAM is associated with a greater risk of mental and physical health problems, including eating disorders and depression.

Likewise, if you are the child of a parent who is or was an alcoholic (or had other addiction problems) and are experiencing one or more of the issues above or any sort of psychological distress, please seek out support. You are not alone, and you deserve help and treatment.

The Effects of Parental Alcoholism on Children

A parent's substance abuse can have other effects on children besides parent-child interactions. For example, if a parent loses a job because of drinking or drug use, the child suffers the economic consequences, especially if this is the household's only income.
